This infographic will help you understand the difference between hazard and risk, two terms that are often incorrectly used as synonyms. A hazard is something that has the potential to cause harm while risk is the likelihood of harm taking place, based on exposure to that hazard.

HAZARD VS. RISK



HAZARD

is the potential to cause harm



when crossing a road, cars are a hazard

RISK

is the likelihood of harm taking place



when crossing a highway, the risk of ar



when crossing a country road, the risk o

HAZARD

in foods can be...



physical for instance pieces of bones in feb products



for instance harmful bacteria, viruses or parasites



chemical for instance mercur in fish or acrylamide in starchy food

RISK

is determined by the **exposure**...



...to a hazard

Example: Salmonella in egg is a hazard



if eaten raw



the chance of

the risk of food poisoning is high for instance cooking thoroughly kills Salmonella



the chance of exposure is low

the **risk** of food poisoning is **low**
